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Dear Mayor Overall,

#### We need your help!

A proud member of our business community, Tascha Loadsman, was diagnosed with Motor Neurone Disease (MND) in January 2020. MND is a debilitating disease that affects the nerves, resulting in reduced communication between the brain and muscles that enable us to move, speak, swallow and breathe.

There is no cure for MND and life expectancy is 2-3yrs on average. In people with MND, the motor neurones gradually degenerate and die, causing the muscles to weaken and waste away.

Tasch and her husband Matt have spent the majority of their adult lives serving their country in the Australian Defence Force (some 39 years combined including Operational Service overseas), before settling in Queanbeyan in 2013 where they have been busy running successful small businesses and raising their five boys. Sadly, due to Tasch's diagnosis she had to close her very popular shoe store in Queanbeyan, Main Street Shoes.

Tasch's condition has deteriorated to the point she is now wheelchair bound and confined to the downstairs section of her home, away from family living spaces. Tasch and Matt have fought hard to gain funding for appropriate in home supports from the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) without success, all the while she has been unable to navigate her home to spend precious time with her family, unnecessarily impacting on her quality of life.

For Tasch, family is the most important thing to her and the ability to access the living areas of her home and the backyard to take part in family gatherings is simply not possible due to her condition.

Having committed so much precious time to fighting for the supports she needs, a small team of us have rallied around the Loadsman family and are taking up this fight on their behalf. We have commenced planning for a local fundraising social event (with food, music and games) to raise the funds needed to install a lift in Tasch's home.
