Heritage in our Region

The Queanbeyan-Palerang Regional Council area includes the townships of Queanbeyan, Bungendore, Braidwood and Captains Flat. Braidwood itself is the only heritage listed town in NSW.

The Region's significant heritage values are reflective of its strong indigenous and non-indigenous history.

Heritage Items

Items can be listed in Council's respective Local Environmental Plans (LEPs) as either State items or Local items. A house may also be within the Heritage Conservation Area. Heritage Awards


The Heritage Awards presentation is part of the Heritage Festival each year. Nominations for the Heritage Awards are accepted throughout the year and close at the end of February.

Works completed in the last two years are eligible. There are cash prizes and certificates for winners of the different categories. Nomination forms are available on Council's website.



Heritage Grant Funding

As funding becomes available for projects that contribute to heritage outcomes in the Queanbeyan-Palerang local government area, this is advertised through newspapers and on Council's website. This usually occurs around June each year.



The funding is offered in two parts, one for homeowners looking to do works on their property called the 'Local Places Heritage Grants' and another called 'Special Heritage Grants' which is aimed at providing community groups with funding to complete works on buildings such as heritage halls, churches and galleries.

Some great outcomes have been achieved for owners, community groups and heritage in our area through these grants.
