#### Laing O'Rourke update

Work is soon beginning on the clean-up of properties in and around Nerriga destroyed by summer's bushfires.

Teams from Laing O'Rourke, appointed by the NSW Government to coordinate the clean-up, will start clearing debris from residential and eligible small business properties in Nerriga and surrounding localities including Corang, Oallen, Tomboye and Wog Wog over the coming month.

The NSW and Commonwealth governments are covering the cost of the clean-up and there is still time for owners of eligible properties to sign up if they have not already done so. You must opt in to have your property cleaned up. **Call Service NSW on 13 77 88** 

#### Message from the Mayor

During these difficult times the Queanbeyan-Palerang Bushfire Local Recovery Committee continues to meet fortnightly (now via audio-visual link) focussing on coordinating the implementation of the Recovery Action Plan, identifying and pre-empting local and regional recovery issues, ensuring our affected communities are kept informed of progress made



and that recovery activities are in line with the NSW Recovery and Regional Plans. The LRC comprises the Mayor (Chair), Local Emergency Management Officer, RFS, NSW Police, Office of Emergency Management, QPRC Recovery Coordination Team, NSW Health, Disaster Welfare, LLS and NPWS representatives. Service NSW and Public Works/Laing O'Rourke representatives also attend.

Like most communities, Queanbeyan-Palerang has been significantly impacted by the Coronavirus (COVID-19) shutdown restrictions. Earlier this month, Council resolved to extend hardship provisions for residential and business ratepayers suffering under the COVID-19 pandemic, similar to previous Council resolutions that extended hardship relief for drought and bushfire affected ratepayers.

Council will be considering a draft Financial Assistance Policy – Drought, Bushfire, COVID-19 at its meeting on Wednesday 22 April, with a view to seeking community feedback. The draft policy is an extension of Council's existing Hardship Policy provisions, and reflects previous Council resolutions. It contains provisions to support the community – individuals, businesses and community groups, in the short term and medium term.

#### BlazeAid

BlazeAid is a volunteer-based organisation that works with families and individuals in rural Australia after natural disasters such as fires and floods. Working alongside the rural families, volunteers help to rebuild fences and other structures that have been damaged or destroyed.

Equally important, volunteers also help to lift the spirits of people who are often facing devastating losses through bushfires or flood. BlazeAid volunteers work in a disasteraffected area for many months, not only helping individuals and families, but also helping rebuild the local communities.

BlazeAid has a camp at the Braidwood Showground and has now set up a second camp at Nerriga. 188 properties have registered, with 85 completed.

To date BlazeAid has completed 78km of new fencing, 280km of repaired fencing and erected more than 10,778 star pickets. Thank you to all the BlazeAid volunteers.

#### Replacement of damaged boundary fences

The NSW Government has committed \$209 million to help bushfire-affected landholders with the cost of rebuilding boundary fences adjoining public lands.

Private landholders who share a boundary with public land and were impacted by the fires of late 2019 and early 2020 are eligible to receive up to \$5,000 per kilometre to contribute to the replacement of damaged boundary fences. Note that for the purposes of this grant, public lands includes:

- National parks
- Forestry Corporation land
- Traveling stock reserves
- Crown reserves,
- Tenured roads and leased roads managed by Roads and Maritime Services or Local Government.

Grants can be issued retrospectively to cover costs already incurred by landholders replacing fire damaged fencing where a boundary is shared with public lands.
