Clean-up

The Government-funded NSW bushfire clean-up program continues to progress at pace with more than **2,800** bushfire affected properties cleared across the State as at 30 June, giving communities the chance to start again.

In Queanbeyan-Palerang 82 properties have been cleared by Laing O'Rourke and they are continuing to work in the area to complete the clean-up of registered properties.

The primary focus of the clean-up is to remove destroyed or damaged buildings and associated safety hazards and debris that could impede people rebuilding their homes or businesses.

Salvation Army Bushfire Recovery Grants

The Salvation Army has grants available to assist people impacted by the 2019-2020 bushfires.

Hardship recovery grant is available for families or individuals experiencing ongoing extreme hardship as a result of the bushfire.

The loss of residence grant provides assistance to individuals and families in bushfire impacted areas whose primary place of residence (owned or leased) has been destroyed or rendered uninhabitable due to the 2019-2020 bushfires

Assessment for a Bushfire Recovery Grant is based on an individual needs basis. If you've previously been assessed by The Salvation Army for bushfire assistance (2019-2020 bushfires), you do not need to provide these verification documents again.

Red Cross Bushfire Financial Assistance

Financial assistance is available for bushfire-affected people in financial hardship.

The cash grants available are:

Emergency grant for people who have lost their homes.

Injury grant for people who were hospitalised due to the fires.

Primary residence repair grant for home owneroccupiers whose homes have been structurally damaged. This includes destruction or damage to critical private water, septic and/or power infrastructure.

Re-establishment grant to help people who lost their primary place of residence – house, caravan or mobile home, whether owned or rented – to have somewhere safe to live.
