

**ARTIST/ Facilitator Expressions of Interest:  
Moore Park Skate Bowl Youth Mural Project**

**Project Brief  
[EOIs due COB 6 July]**

Queanbeyan-Palerang Regional Council (QPRC) has secured a grant from the NSW Government's Youth Opportunities Grant Scheme. This project will involve local youth working with a professional mural artist to design and paint a mural *inside* the Moore Park Skate-bowl in Queanbeyan.

Organisations funded under the Youth Opportunities program must:

- partner with young people to deliver a youth-led and youth-driven community project
- improve young people's access to and inclusion in community activities such as sport and recreation, cultural and other activities
- provide young people with knowledge and skills to strengthen their ability to participate in their local community and support future economic participation
- recognise the contribution young people make to their local community.

The budget for this project is up to \$15,000.

Artist / facilitator must undertake the following tasks:

- Facilitate with QPRC staff 2 x 3 hour design workshops with 8-10 young people
- Undergo or provide your valid NSW working with children check
- Create Artwork design based on consultation workshops with youth
- Consultation with painting contractor on site for primer colours etc
- Skate-bowl Mural artwork site preparation work prior to installation workshops
- 3 x Artwork installation/painting workshops with 8-10 participants per workshop
- Finalise and tidy up artwork without workshop participants (please advise us how many days or hours in total estimated to complete the job)
- Undertake the project between August - November 2022
- Hold NO copyright over the completed public artwork

Key project & site information:

- Moore Park skate bowl is located next to the Queanbeyan Aquatic Centre
- Based on aerial imagery, the skate bowl and platforms only are approximately 655m<sup>2</sup>.
- Preparation of the skate bowl (cleaning/stripping excess paint, clean and prime) will be undertaken by a QPRC-contracted painting company.
- Site safety equipment and barriers will be supplied by QPRC
- All paint and paintbrushes for young people will be supplied by QPRC
- Final artwork will be sealed with anti-graffiti protective coat by QPRC contractors

**EOI Selection Criteria: Due by 6 July to QPRC Community Team**

1. Please supply a 1-2 page professional CV including: qualifications, facilitation experience and include phone & email contacts for at least two referees from past projects.
2. Please supply photographic examples of at least two past mural projects undertaken by yourself with details of location and project co-ordinators contact details
3. Please tell us about your experience working with young people aged 13-25 years of age on art or mural projects, at skate parks in particular
4. Please tell us what your approach would be to working in a co-design framework with young people from a range of backgrounds to come up with creative designs that reflect young people's ideas and perspectives.
5. Please tell us about your style and whether you can adapt it to fit in with surrounding artworks or pieces to ensure a cohesive aesthetic.
6. Please tell us how you will organise/engage the youth participants to paint the skate bowl with the collaborative design
7. Please provide a broad design concept and images based on the skate bowl at Moore Park. Please note the design will be informed by consultation workshops with youth, however this is just to get an idea of what your thoughts are on how it could look. The design should also be related to the social, cultural or environmental context of Queanbeyan in some way.

**Selection process information:**

1. After the EOI deadline of 6 July a selection panel will review all expressions of interest, and interview in-person or by phone shortlisted applicants.
2. Winning applicant will be notified by email.
3. Wining applicant will be expected to sign a contract outlining the terms and conditions of the work expected of them.
