Environa Drive Open

Environa Drive opened to the public late last year. The road forms the fourth arm of the Tompsitt Drive intersection and connects to the Poplars Innovation Precinct, Queanbeyan Regional Sports Complex (which had its first sod turned in early December), Jerrabomberra High School and the South Jerra residential estate.

The new road and infrastructure has been a collaboration between NSW Government, Queanbeyan-Palerang Regional Council, Poplars and Village Building Company, and the construction contractor for the first section, Wodens.

Williamsdale Road Works

Williamsdale Road is the busiest unsealed road in QPRC. An additional \$2.9m from the NSW Government has been allocated and will be used to seal as much of the road as possible. This funding is on top of over \$1.2m worth of Local Roads and Community Infrastructure grants secured in 2020 and 2021.

Future works plans will go to a council meeting in the coming weeks.

Captains Flat Road

The \$10 million upgrade of Captains Flat Road, between Briars Sharrow Road and Captains Flat village, will see 21 km of the road stabilised, rehabilitated and in some parts completely realigned and rebuilt.

Preparation works have begun with drainage and shoulder widening before the major road rehabilitation commences in March. This first section covers 18.2km from the Briars Sharrow Road intersection.

Funding for this project was initially spread across four years until 2023-24, but the final year of funding has been brought forward and we now anticipate completing the major upgrade in 2022-23.

Parks and playgrounds update

Thanks to funding support from various Australian Government and NSW Government grants, along with the support of business and developer contributions, a range of upgrades of playgrounds, sportsgrounds and parks are in progress including the Braidwood Rec Ground, Bungendore Playground and the Araluen Camparound.

Work at the Braidwood Rec Ground has begun. Once complete the ground will have new cricket nets, goal posts, fencing and seating. We are continuing the piping of the final section of the creek that runs through the Rec Ground, providing space for the new Braidwood Skate Park.

Construction of the new Bungendore Playground will begin this month. This fantastic upgrade will be an asset for local families and a drawcard for visitors to Bungendore.

The Araluen Campground is getting a new toilet facility, 100,000 litre water tank with dedicated bore, and new shelters and seating. The project planning is now underway.

This project will rehabilitate the pavement, reconstruct footpaths and upgrade drainage with heritage considerations in place.

Captains Flat
