Quarterly **budget review**

Each quarter we review our budget statements.

These statements are reported to Council in accordance with local advernment regulations and we have committed to present the statements in a simplified form in this newsletter. The Quarterly Budget Review Statement looks at the figures by: Fund and Service, Capital expenditure, Cash and reserves, Key performance indicators, Contracts, Consultancy and leaal, and Loans.

In this summary we look at the General Fund and overall financial position.

General Fund - projected result 2022-23 financial year

The General Fund is the main operating account of Council. This account pays for employees, infrastructure like roads and parks as well as electricity and general maintenance.

The projected loss for this year has decreased due to internal savings, increased Fees & Charges received as our facilities opened up after COVID and the 90% compensation payment for the compulsory acquisition of our Bungendore properties, which is recorded as asset sales.

We have also secured more grant funding for projects.

This Quarterly Budget Review shows that we can return to a sustainable financial position assuming the adoption of the rate variation.

We have made some internal savings and received better than expected income, however, there have also been increases to the cost of materials and services over all aspects of Council operations from construction, road building, maintenance, interest payments and professional fees such as external audit.

While we wait to hear back from IPART about the proposed special rate variation, we need to prepare our budgets on the assumption that it will be approved. This means that we continue to find savings in our organisation and will find \$5.5 million in annual savings as per scenario 2 of the Long-Term Financial Plan along with

a special rate variation of 18% per year for the next 3 years. This supports our long-term financial position and will allow us to continue to maintain our assets within the constraints of a limited budget and support our community.






Council has three funds. The water and sewer funds pay for water and sewer projects and maintenance.

Queanbeyan Cemetery

We have placed a moratorium on sales of pre-purchase Right of Interments at Queanbeyan General Cemetery to ensure that residents who need immediate burial options are prioritised. This decision ensures that remaining plots will be available for the immediate needs of local residents and that we can honour existing reservations.

While we have been exploring options for a new Memorial Park we have increased capacity at the general cemetery by repurchasing redundant reservations, reclaiming laneways, and removing some unhealthy trees.

We have been progressing a proposal for a new Memorial Park at the corner of Old Cooma Road and Burra Road, near Googong. The next stages of the Memorial Park include developing a Master Plan and studies that are required as part of a development application.

Consultation with the community and stakeholders on the Master Plan for the Memorial Park will begin soon. In the meantime, those with an existing plot at the Queanbeyan General Cemetery are guaranteed their reservation.



Each year we publish a draft Operational Plan, Fees and Charges, and Revenue Policy for community feedback.

Braidwood Pool upgrade

Council awarded the contract for upgrades to the Braidwood Pool to Rice Constructions Group in late March.

The work includes upgrades to the changerooms, control room and kiosk. The Braidwood Pool has been serving the community since 1966 and we're excited to finally be able to give this facility the upgrades it deserves.

With funding from Round 3 of the NSW Government's Stronger Country Communities Fund (SCCF) and remaining funds from Phase 4 of the Federal Government's Local Roads and Community Infrastructure (LRCI) Program, we will be able to complete these overdue and much anticipated upgrades.

> The project will continue through winter and the works will be complete before the 2023-24 swimming season.

Braidwood Showground update

The lighting and electrical upgrade at the Braidwood Showground is making good progress again after a series of delays.

The contractors have been able to get most of the electric components installed. The light poles were assembled and lifted onto their concrete bases in early April. Despite wet weather, contractors have been on site working on the electrical 'fit off' of all the boards, poles and turrets before they power the site.

This project is being funded through a Crown Lands Improvement fund and we expect the work will be complete by the end of April.



Bin Contamination Policy

As part of our waste collection service we look at what ends up in people's bins. This helps us understand what items people might be binning incorrectly.

We now have a Bin Contamination Policy to support our waste officers, and this formalises our process so we can keep helping residents put the right things in their bins.

If your bin has the wrong things in it you may get a tag attached to your bin letting you know what was wrong, and a letter will be sent to the property. This will include information about: what goes in you bin, where to get up to date information and who to contact with any questions.

A household that has three or more contamination events without contacting Council may have their collection suspended. This is why we really encourage anyone with questions to get in touch.

Our waste team want everyone to put the right things in each bin and they're always happy to help.

QCCP project update

The Queanbeyan Civic and Cultural Precinct (QCCP) which will include space for Council staff, our new library, and three and a half floors of commercial leases is nearing completion. This is a key project in the revitalisation of the Queanbeyan CBD, however construction has not been without its challenges.

Like other large construction projects, the QCCP has been affected by COVID-19-related delays, worker shortages, supply chain issues and rising material costs. Most of the cost increase has been attributed to unavoidable delays associated with critical components of the project. One of these was the high voltage substation, which services the CBD power that could not be removed until replacement infrastructure was in place.

Construction contractors, ADCO have taken the brunt of worker shortages and increasing material costs. However, under the contract unavoidable variations to the project are claimable.

Council has approved variations totalling \$6.1 million, which will be funded by an extension to our current loans as well as a contribution from Village Building Company for their additional underground infrastructure. This represents a variance of 6.3% on the original budget, which in current times is a good result.
