Queanbeyan Civic and Cultural **Precinct underway**

Work on the Queanbeyan Civic and Cultural Precinct officially commenced in July. The first sod was turned on the site by Mayor, Cr Tim Overall and CEO Peter Tegart, Dr Aunty Matilda House and ADCO Construction Manager, Matthew Wilkinson. Dr Aunty Matilda House also performed a traditional smoking ceremony to acknowledge and pay respect to the traditional custodians of the land.

Now that work is underway there have been changes to parking in the CBD.

MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR, TIM OVERALL

It has been a busy few months at Council with our Towards 2042 Community Strategic Plan consultation, the postponed local government elections and beginning of work for the Queanbeyan Civic and Cultural Precinct.

Grading on rural roads has been progressing, with work in the last month including Hoskinstown Road, Rossi Road and resheeting on Harolds Cross Road. There have also been significant works on Tompsitt Drive reconstructing the lanes towards Lanyon Drive.

Other activities include: securing over \$360,000 of Federal Blackspot Funding for dangerous intersections, progressing the Botanic-Sister City Gardens in Queanbeyan to the detailed design phase and receiving the Construction Management Plan for the seal of Miners Road and replacement of Foxlow Street Bridge in Captains Flat.






In October, Council and the NSW EPA will run two Chemical CleanOut sessions where residents can correctly dispose of household chemicals and hard to recycle materials for free.

Bungendore Roundabout

Work on the Bungendore Roundabout is expected to commence by September and construction is expected to take five months, weather permitting. During construction one lane of traffic will be maintained, however, drivers should expect delays and plan their trip accordingly.

The roundabout will improve traffic flow and formalise some parking in the area as well as improving pedestrian safety with designated refuge crossings. Some driveways will also be relocated to improve safety.

Main Street Upgrade Fund Applications Open

A Main Street Upgrade Fund has recently been established to assist owners of commercial buildings to undertake renovations and improvements to façades that contribute to the public streetscape.

This program provides financial assistance on a dollar for dollar basis (excluding GST) for eligible buildings located within the Queanbeyan Central Business District and business-zoned areas in the main streets of Bungendore and Braidwood.

Pet Ownership

Did you know that lifetime registration is now free for rescue animals? This includes animals from shelters and other approved agencies.

This change was made by the NSW Government and applies to desexed animals.

Getting your pet desexed is the best way to prevent unwanted litters, it also has a range of health benefits. Desexed animals tend to live longer, have a lower risk of certain cancers and are less likely to roam.

Regional Sports Complex

The Regional Sports Complex in Jerrabomberra is now in the detailed design phase.

Initial site preparation, including demolition and waste removal, was completed in late 2020 alongside initial archaeological surveys.

An Aboriginal archaeological survey was then required for the DA to progress. This work was completed in late July 2021 and the findings were presented to NSW Heritage, so that the DA can be determined by the Regional Planning Panel, and bulk earthworks commence.

Next steps for Lascelles Street

The water main upgrade on Lascelles Street, Braidwood between Ryrie Street and Wallace Street began in early August.

The work includes laying the new main along the southern side of Lascelles Street, and then connecting the existing services.

The project is expected to be completed by mid-September, weather permitting.

Once this connection upgrade is completed the Lascelles Street upgrades can finally begin above ground. After a range of delays, including Heritage NSW approval, we hope to begin the work before the end of the year.
