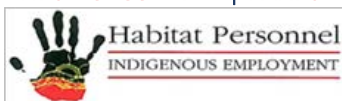

All our consultants have completed the WorkCover course in OHS General Induction for Construction Work in NSW and we also have current certificates of Public Liability and Workers Compensation Insurances.

Our consultants have extensive experience in Aboriginal heritage assessment work. Members have worked on a variety of sites around the Canberra and South Eastern New South Wales region and have helped to identify many different types of objects and places with Aboriginal cultural heritage significance.

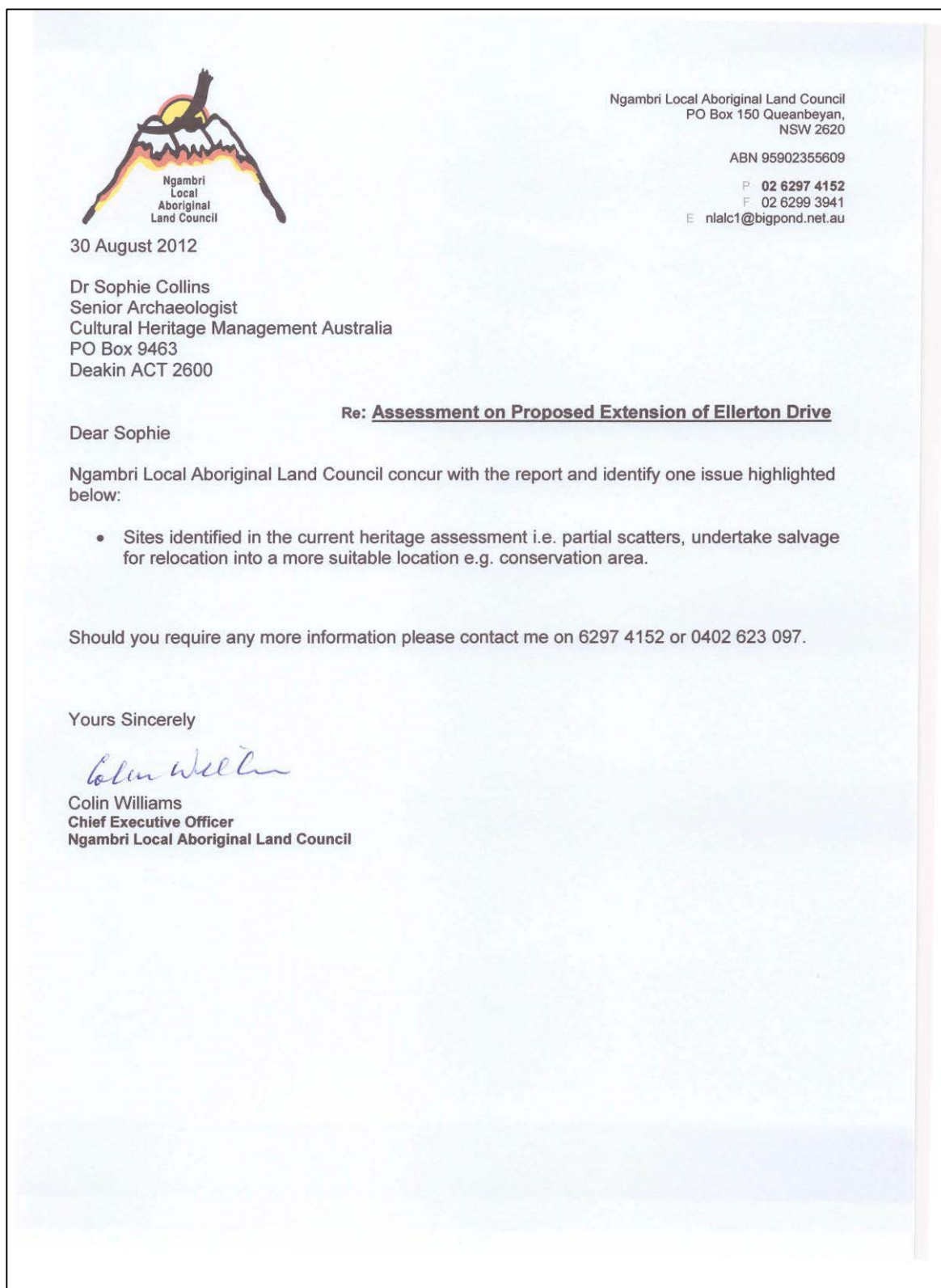

Buru Ngunawal Aboriginal Corporation (BNAC) participated in the cultural heritage archaeological field survey for the Ellerton Dr Extension, Queanbeyan to identify any Aboriginal cultural heritage sites or areas of cultural significance to the local Ngunawal people. As you may appreciate any planned work to be undertaken in the area that lies within our tribal boundaries will impact on our cultural heritage. We therefore appreciate that the proper protocol of advising and consulting with us as descendants of the Traditional Custodians has occurred.

The investigation was carried out on the 2nd of August 2012 with your organisation, Cultural Heritage Management Australia (CHMA) P/L. During the survey there were several sites identified in the study area as per the aims of the investigation works.

BNAC have read the draft report from CHMA and support the measures to be implemented according to the recommendations as proposed under the Avoiding and/or Minimising Harm subsection of the Executive Summary.

As an addition to those recommendations BNAC would like to have put in place a cultural awareness process for the site induction which should include the requirement that all vehicular travel should be only within the surveyed easement to minimise the risk of impacting on sites outside the easement that are not included as part of this investigation process. BNAC suggests that the construction company be informed of the OEH penalties that can be imposed for impacting sites knowingly or unknowingly.

BNAC would suggest that if there are to be any changes made that may impact on these recommendations that we be contacted immediately.

Native Title and Freehold Land

As it appears that your request was related to an area of land which is freehold it should be noted that under the *Native Title Act 1993* (Cth), the valid grant of a freehold estate (other than certain types of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander land) on or before 23 December 1996 is known as a ‘previous exclusive possession act’. This means that native title has been extinguished over the area.

Native title claimants are not allowed to include land and waters covered by previous exclusive possession acts in their applications; therefore they would normally exclude freehold areas. Although a native title application may be made over freehold land on the basis that freehold was invalidly granted, the chances of this happening are very low.

Search results and the existence of native title

Please note that the enclosed information from the Register of Native Title Claims and/or the Schedule of Applications is **not** confirmation of the existence of native title in this area. This cannot be confirmed until the Federal Court makes a determination that native title does or does not exist in relation to the area. Searching the NNTT Registers in New South Wales

Search service

On request the National Native Title Tribunal may search its public registers for you. A search may assist you in finding out whether any native title applications (claims), determinations or agreements exist over a particular area of land or water.

In New South Wales native title cannot exist on privately owned land including family homes or farms.

What information can a search provide?

A search can confirm whether any applications, agreements or determinations are registered in a local government area. Relevant information, including register extracts and application summaries, will be provided.

In NSW because we cannot search the registers in relation to individual parcels of land we search by local government area.

Most native title applications do not identify each parcel of land claimed. They have an external boundary and then identify the areas not claimed within the boundary by reference to types of land tenure e.g., freehold, agricultural leasehold, public works.

What if the search shows no current applications?

If there is no application covering the local government area this only indicates that at the time of the search either the Federal Court had not received any claims in relation to the local government area or the Tribunal had not yet been notified of any new native title claims.

It does not mean that native title does not exist in the area.

Native title may exist over an area of land or waters whether or not a claim for native title has been made.

Where the information is found

The information you are seeking is held in three registers and on an applications database.

National Native Title Register

The National Native Title Register contains determinations of native title by the High Court, Federal Court and other courts.

Register of Native Title Claims

The Register of Native Title Claims contains applications for native title that have passed a registration test.

Registered claims attract rights, including the right to negotiate about some types of proposed developments.

Register of Indigenous Land Use Agreements

The Register of Indigenous Land Use Agreements contains agreements made with people who hold or assert native title in an area.

The register identifies development activities that have been agreed by the parties.

Schedule of Native Title Applications

The Schedule of Native Title Applications contains a description of the location, content and status of a native title claim.

This information may be different to the information on the Register of Native Title Claims, e.g., because an amendment has not yet been tested.

Cultural Heritage Management Australia (CHMA) and the Queanbeyan City Council are inviting submissions from Aboriginal persons and organisations holding cultural knowledge relevant to the local Queanbeyan Area who wish to be consulted regarding the Ellerton Drive Extension Cultural Heritage Survey

The Queanbeyan City Council has commissioned CHMA to conduct cultural heritage investigations of the proposed Ellerton Drive Extension corridor.

The Ellerton Drive Extension is intended to provide a link between East Queanbeyan at the termination point of the existing Ellerton Dr and Karabar at Old Cooma Rd.
