

For this reason, we should call the centre 'JJ Wright Centre': 1885 – 1888 – J J Wright elected Queanbeyan's first Mayor.	Like most indigenous names, the problem is pronunciation. It needs to be phonetically displayed and explained. That in itself renders the name inappropriate. When only handfuls or scores of people can actually pronounce a name, it is divisive/ exclusive, not inclusive. Why isn't it just called 'Platypus Walk'. The second sentence of your intro is correct when it states that this naming process provides an opportunity to acknowledge and pay respect to First Nations history and language. However, it equally provides an opportunity to do exactly the same for our European forebears. Unless there is a Minute or similar on Council's books requiring the use of indigenous acknowledgement why not take the opportunity to acknowledge the role and impact that both have provided. If you wish to divide that area into four parts - then an equal split seems reasonable to me with two names for each of the indigenous and European role being equitable.	If this name is Ngunnawal for platypus, then it seems strange to me that it is not associated with a water-based environment rather than a walk.	Your explanation provides a definitive link to the Ngunnawal people in two instances, being the walk and the gardens, but no direct acknowledgement of the Ngambri in the others. Whilst it may well be there, there is no direct reference and this appears somewhat unbalanced in my view. I understand that both mobs lay claim to this area but it does not appear they have been equally acknowledged. Having no knowledge whatsoever of the make up of the advisory committee, I cannot comment on the merits of either or both in terms of contributions to the naming.	In closing, I revert to my earlier comments regarding lack of recognition to the not insignificant role played by the early European settlers in the area.

Council has treated us as tokenistic and refuted our thoughtful proposal. I am wanting to lodge a formal petition to refute the name Onyong - that name was not supported by the Traditional Custodians or Community or the Advisory Committee. I want to support the use of Louise Brown in the garden area near the Q. Further, Nellie Hamilton already has a bridge and other locations named after her. I do not feel Council is respectful of the Aboriginal Advisory Committee and do not have faith in Council's ability to be objective or work collaboratively with the Aboriginal Advisory Committee.
