SRV update (IPART consultation finished)	In November 2022, Council considered a report regarding the organisation's financial sustainability. Council resolved to consult with the community on three scenarios, all of which contained a Special Rate Variation or varying amounts.  Following the consultation, Council agreed to submit an application to the Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal for scenario 2:  18% rate increase in 2023-24, 24-25 and 25-26 (64% culminative increase)  \$5.5m\$ in savings each year  Council submitted its application to IPART. IPART had a round of community consultation (independent from Council) open until 5 May.	IPART will make a final determination for all Special Rate Variations in June 2023.  The first rates notice of 2023-24 will be distributed in July/August for payment on 31 August.
