Memorial Park	Council's consultant (Ecological) has been undertaking groundwater monitoring since January 2019 in order to determine groundwater levels and any potential for impacts on nearby land. This 12 month period of monitoring has recently concluded, and preliminary advice from the consultant suggests the site does contain suitable areas for cemetery uses for the long term. Note this is yet to be finally confirmed. To account for the recent dry period, it is now intended to extend the monitoring for an additional 2 month period. This should ensure more recent rain events are also captured in the data for comparison.
