

What is being done?

Traffic signals will be installed at the intersection of Crawford and Antill Streets. This will improve safety for drivers and provide a signalised pedestrian crossing.

At the intersection of Crawford/Erin/Campbell Streets turning movements will be restricted.

There will also be changes to parking along Antill Street

Why do we need to do this work?

Both intersections have experienced vehicle crashes, with most crashes being cross-intersection crashes.

The Queanbeyan CBD Masterplan identifies Antill Street as a distributor road that will experience increased traffic as the population increases.

Who is involved in this project?

Council is coordinating the works on this project. The project is fully funded under the Australian Government Black Spot Program.

Council will contract out the work.

When will the work begin?

The work is likely to start in mid-August 2022 and take approximately four months to complete.

- Stage 1 Crawford/Antill Street intersection
- Stage 2 Crawford/Erin/Campbell Street intersection

Impact on residents and businesses

Some properties may experience minor access changes and reduced parking options for their customers, clients, and staff during construction. After construction, two parking spots on Antill Street near the post office will be relocated in front of the medical centre. An additional two parking spots will be added as part of the relocation.

During construction of Stage 1, Antill Street will be closed west of Crawford Street. Detours will be in place and access to all properties and driveways near the intersection will be maintained throughout construction.

Impact on drivers

Temporary speed limits will be in place throughout the works. At stages during the project, we will need to close one lane with only one lane open for traffic.

Please observe the roadwork signage and obey the directions of traffic controllers. Reduced speed limits will provide a safe environment for workers on foot and minimise risks to other road users.

Impact on pedestrians

At stages during the project, the footpath will be closed, and a detour for pedestrians will be in place. Please observe detour signs and obey directions of traffic controllers.
