

Magpie season

Between August and October these protected birds get into quite the flap if humans or pets venture too close to their nests.

Magpies may continue to nest in a chosen territory for up to 20 years, and it is best to avoid these areas where possible during breeding season.

Wood smoke: reduce the risk

Wood smoke is a major air pollutant during winter and has been linked to adverse health affects.

Wood smoke includes chemicals like carbon monoxide and other tiny particles that can work their way into our lungs, bloodstream and other organs.

These chemicals can trigger asthma attacks, allergic responses, heart attacks and stroke. Children and elderly people are most at risk, however anyone can be negatively affected by exposure to wood smoke.

While removing wood smoke from our homes and urban areas is the best way to reduce our exposure to these pollutants we can also improve the way we burn.

Tips to reduce smoke from your existing wood heater include:

- Burning small logs of aged, dry hardwood
- Never burning rubbish, driftwood or painted/treated wood
- Stacking wood loosely in the firebox
- Don't let your heater smoulder overnight - keep enough air in the fire to maintain a flame
- Have a professional clean your chimney every year



Back Creek Bridge replacement

As part of the NSW Government's Fixing Country Bridges program we are replacing the bridge over Back Creek on Wallaces Gap Road in Bendoura.

Initial vegetation clearing has been completed and the old bridge will remain in use while the components for the new bridge are installed beside it.

The contractor, HD Civil, set up the site in July and the works are expected to take 18 weeks, weather permitting.

Pensioner rebates for Council rates

accordance with the Local Government Act 1993.

These rebates are \$250 for general rates and domestic waste management charges, \$87.50 for water charges, and \$87.50 for sewerage charges to all eligible pensioner ratepayers.

The NSW Government reimburses Council for 55% of this rebate and Council funds the remaining 45%.

Council also provides a voluntary rebate of \$40 to all pensioners, bringing the total maximum

Braidwood overland flow investigation

We have engaged consultants to investigate overland flow in Braidwood. This study expands on previous plans and focuses in on detailed options to mitigate overland flow in areas like Wallace Street that are significantly affected by localised heavy rainfall.

The consultants are asking for photos and descriptions of drainage and flooding patterns from the community and this information will be used to cross check the results of the flood models developed as part of the Braidwood Major Overland Flow Investigation.

Fee changes for companion animals

The NSW Government has made changes to mandatory Companion Animals Register fees

These changes came into effect on 1 July 2024 and affect cat and dog owners in NSW.

All fees have increased to match CPI and new late fees have been added to encourage pet owners to get their animals desexed.

These fees can be paid via Council.

Key changes

- Puppies and kittens must be registered by 12 weeks of age
- Late fees apply for animals not registered by 12 weeks of age
- Late fees apply for animals that are not desexed by 6 months of age (dogs) or 4 months of age (cats)
- Annual fees apply for non-desexed cats after 4 months of age

Be a responsible dog owner

The NSW Companion Animals Act 1998 requires that all dogs need to be kept in an adequately fenced yard or on a leash and under effective control.

Owners can be fined \$330 if their dog is off lead in a public place. Owners can also be fined \$275 if they do not clean up after their animal.
