Wood smoke

Wood produces particle pollution that is harmful to everyone when it burns. To reduce the harmful effects of wood smoke:

1. Clean your chimney every year.
2. Use only dry, aged, untreated wood.
3. Use small logs instead of one large one.
4. Don't let your fire smoulder overnight.
5. Consider a cleaner heating method.

Remember, even in small amounts, wood smoke pollutants can be harmful, especially to young, frail or elderly people.

Araluen Road

Heavy rain caused a series of landslips on Araluen Road during 2020 to 2022. The first three slip sites were completed in early 2023 and work began in late April for the remaining sites.

The first three of these sites are on the sealed section of Araluen Road. These have been cleared, soil nails have been drilled and installed and, at time of writing, concrete work continues.

There are then seven other landslip sites on unsealed sections of Araluen Road that will be repaired.

We thank local road users for driving to conditions, observing roadwork signage and following the directions of traffic controllers until the works are complete.



2023-24 budget

Council has prioritised funding for maintaining and improving our local roads in the 2023-24 budget. The budget is balanced, noting that 2023-24 is the first year of the special rate variation of 18% per year for 3 years. The budget has been prepared in line with the application to the Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal for the special rate variation. The special rate variation we have applied for requires budget savings of \$5.5m per year which have been identified in various projects, both capital and operational.

The capital works program is valued at \$80m, nearly \$30m of that is in our water, sewer and waste funds. The works program relies on funding from rates, grants, developer contributions, loans and reserves.

There will be more than \$20m worth of road and bridge upgrades, upgrades to aquatic amenities at Braidwood and Queanbeyan and a major restoration of the Captains Flat Pool. The Queanbeyan Civic and Cultural Precinct will be completed along with the first stages of the Regional Sports Complex at Jerrabomberra and the Bungendore Sports Hub.

The community feedback during the special rate variation consultation showed how much Council services were valued, and this budget has maintained current levels of services to all our libraries, community events and sporting fields, parks and amenities.

Council has also resolved to extend the additional \$40 pensioner rebate that was previously available only to Queanbeyan pensioners to all eligible pensioners in QPRC. That means that eligible pensioners will be able to receive rebates of up to \$460 off their general rates and water and sewer charges.

The draft documents have been on public exhibition since early May and the final documents will be adopted at the Council Meeting on 28 June. The final documents will consider all the feedback collected via Your Voice, at community meetings and other submissions.

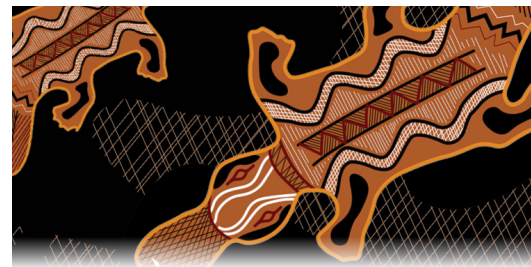

Monaro Street update

Upgrading the main street of Queanbeyan has been a priority of Council and the community for many years. Council accepted \$10m of grant funding under the NSW Government's Drought Stimulus Package in 2020 and also agreed to arrange loan funding of \$5.7m as co-contribution for the project.

On 26 April 2023 Council resolved to seek a variation from the Department of Regional NSW for an extension of time on the funding agreement. This will allow us to proceed to tenders for the detailed design. A detailed design will get the project 'shovel ready' and ensure that we have a better understanding of the complete costs of the project before we proceed to the construction phase.

The project will replace the road surface and update some underground infrastructure. The current concept design includes the widening of footpaths, new paving, additional plantings and lighting, reduced median width, a lower speed limit, changed turning options at intersections, new street furniture and wayfinding.
