

Disaster Recovery **Funding**

Late last year areas near Braidwood received more than 250ml of rain in three hours during the Boxing Day flood event.

The downpour opened a gully 3m deep and 15m long on Cooma Road near Witts Creek, destabilised abutments on nearby bridges, and damaged culverts on Hereford Hall

While we were able to complete emergency works to reopen roads at the time, we required further funding to make long-term repairs.

In March the Boxing Day storm event was declared eligible for Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements (DRFA).

The DRFA is jointly funded between the Australian and NSW governments, and provides financial assistance with disaster recovery costs.

The financial assistance helps Council with the costs of restoring essential public assets like roads and bridges and allows us to engage contractors to assess the damage and undertake the work.

Queanbeyan pickleball

The Queanbeyan Park Tennis Club recently upgraded the East Queanbeyan courts on Waniassa

As part of the upgrade the tennis courts were resurfaced and pickleball courts were installed along with lights for night play.

The upgrade works were primarily funded by a \$531,128 grant from the NSW Government's Stronger Country Communities Fund.

Halfway Creek Road

At the time of writing Halfway Creek Road is expected to be complete by the end of April.

This link road that extends from Malbon Street to the Bungendore Sports Hub includes Halfway Creek bridge which was installed last year.

Finishing touches to the bridge including a handrail and line marking are expected to be completed during April.

Oallen Road rehab

We will be rehabilitating 7.6km of Oallen Road in two sections.

The project involves widening and stabilising the pavement, line marking and installing guardrails.

This project is funded by \$3m from the NSW Government's Fixing Local Roads program and \$150,000 from Council.

Geotechnical investigations are expected to be completed in May. Construction is expected to start in early August and be completed in October 2024.

We expect the bridge components to arrive in July and are seeking quotes and tender responses for installing the bridge, and associated landscaping and

As part of the project, there will also be some upgrades to Monga Lane, which will serve as a detour. This will include a grade and re-sheet, removing some trees, as well as some widening and culvert work.

The first stage of work includes a car park, barbecue and shelter area, bins, water refill station, seating, pedestrian paths, and tree planting.

A contractor has been selected for concreting and installation of park furniture and we expect this to begin soon after power and water are introduced to the site.

Waterwise rebates

Did you know you could be eligible for rebates on rainwater tank installations, or subsidies to replace inefficient toilet cisterns?

Home owners in Braidwood, Bungendore, Captains Flat and Queanbeyan who are connected to town water can apply for a free Waterwise Home Audit on our website. This audit tests water pressure, checks for leaks, and can provide professional advice on your plumbing. Once this is complete you may be eligible for the Retrofit Toilet Subsidy, to reduce water use.

We also have a Rainwater Tank Subsidy designed to encourage more people to install rainwater tanks and connect them to their garden, laundry or toilets.

Pruning urban trees?

Trees in urban areas, including in backyards, help keep our residential areas cooler, improve the streetscape and form important habitat for native species. They are also protected by legislation and regional control plans.

If you want to remove or prune urban trees on your property there are a few different things you need to do. Start by speaking to your neighbour if the tree is on a boundary, then check the controls that apply to where you live and submit an application for the work. If you want to remove a tree, there will need to be a detailed report to support the removal. You can find information about required reports on our

Find relevant controls for your area and submit an application at bit.ly/aprc-urbantrees

If you live in a heritage zone you also need a minor works approval to make changes to a tree. Many residential areas of Braidwood may need this kind of approval. This is a simple application that can also be completed on our website.


