# 1. How many development applications for demolition in the QPRC Heritage Conservation Area have been received since amalgamation?

Council does not collate data in a format that would enable a report of all development applications lodged since amalgamation; which of those were in the conservation area; and further, which of those were for demolition.

A report of this nature is not able to be automated in our current system. It would require an officer to review every development application lodged since amalgamation manually – a labour-intensive task taking substantial time. Council does not have the resources to undertake this task.

# 7. How many applications for demolition in the QPRC Heritage Conservation Area were assessed and/or approved by the QPRC Heritage Advisory Committee?

This information is not readily available. The Heritage Advisory Committee provides comment on development applications which are referred to them. Staff refer all development applications that involve the demolition of a heritage item to the Heritage Advisor and comments are sought from the Heritage Advisory Committee. There may be some occasions in recent past where this would not have occurred if the Heritage Advisory Committee wasn't in place.

# 8. How many decisions to allow demolition in the QPRC Heritage Conservation Area were assessed and/or made solely by staff?

We are unable to answer this question. See response to Q1.

# 9. How many applications for demolition in the QPRC Heritage Conservation Area were duly considered by QPRC Council at a Council Meeting?

As per the response to Q1, not all development applications involving demolition in the conservation area are reported to Council. Council will only consider those applications when the Heritage Advisor or Heritage Advisory Committee are not in support of the demolition.

## 10. What are the DA numbers for these, and what relevant meeting dates?

## General comment/response from QPRC

Although we are unable to answer questions for the period since amalgamation that you are interested in, we can provide some detail on more recent matters.

Phillip Leeson and Associates have been providing the Heritage Advisory Service since 6 November 2023. Since then, there have been four development applications that have involved partial demolition:

- 75 Campbell Street, Queanbeyan DA.2023.0595 Approved 1 May 2024
- 7 Hirst Ave, Queanbeyan DA.2024.0038 Approved 23 May 2024
- 9 Malbon Street, Bungendore DA .2023.0587 Approved 3 October 2024
- 65 Butmaroo Street, Bungendore DA.2023.0543 Approved 15 November 2024

There has been one application for full demolition:

• 101 Henderson Road Queanbeyan – DA.2024.0034 – Approved 2 October 2024

There are no records of applications for demolition of a heritage item being withdrawn in the same period.

Development applications for demolition of a heritage item which have been referred to Council in this period involved:

- Part V demolition of the Jembaicumbene bridges
- The Albion Hotel, Braidwood
