There is a mystery in the Carwoola & Hoskinstown area. Why have so many planes and helicopters come down here? Is there some kind of 'Bermuda Triangle' phenomena occurring just down the road? This is a quiet area that many in the ACT region have never heard of or simply pass through on their way to somewhere else.

Unexpectedly rediscovered during the writing of the history of the Carwoola Rural Fire Brigade, this short local history can now tell the forgotten story behind the strangely high number of crashes and honour the memory of the ten RAAF aircrew who lost their lives here. It is a history that also has many curious and fascinating links to other aspects of Australian history.

Sharing Stories - People and places of Garryowen (Queanbeyan)

Sunday 2 April | 10am - 11am

Garryowen is the historic central area of Queanbeyan which featured brickmakers, nursing hospitals, farms, the town park and cordial factories. Over time the nine farmlets were subdivided and became a residential area.

The walking tour will cover about two kilometres and take about 90 minutes. Robert Campbell Snr. received a Crown grant of 1040 acres in 1837 which became known as Garryowen. His son William George Campbell inherited the land, and he was intent on subdividing and selling the land as residential allotments for the expanding town of Queanbeyan. The stories of the people and places of Garryowen is a glimpse into the town's history.

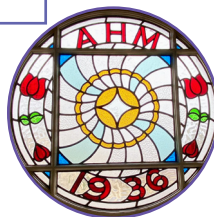
